Funding Request for Dedicated Grants Assistant

Created by Black technologists who have created cutting-edge technology solutions for communities of color in the United States and the Caribbean since 1995, BlackFacts.com stands alone as a pioneer and current leader in delivering advanced technologies for social impact.

As a for-profit social impact venture, BlackFacts.com has consistently faced barriers in accessing public funding, even for its most altruistic projects. To bridge this gap, the BlackFacts Educational Foundation was established, providing a pathway for public and private support to further its mission of creating advanced, innovative but practical technologies that inspire, educate and empower people from historically disadvantaged cultures and communities.

As BlackFacts is self-funded and our team is overallocated maintaining our free public website and our ed-tech platform [Diversity Schoolhouse](#) which drives our revenue, we are seeking funding to hire a dedicated **Grants Assistant** to ensure the Foundation's sustainability and growth.

Position Overview

The Grants Assistant will be a pivotal addition to our team, responsible for:

- **Researching Grants:** Identifying grant opportunities aligned with our mission and objectives.
- **Grant Writing:** Crafting compelling applications to secure funding from foundations, institutions, high net worth individuals, and other sources.
- **Maintaining Correspondence:** Building and sustaining relationships with key organizations and individuals who can amplify our impact.
- **Expanding Awareness:** Engaging stakeholders who would help foster public awareness of the existence of world-class independent Black technologists behind technologies used by millions each year.

This position will enable us to reach untapped funding opportunities and strengthen collaborations with institutions and individuals that align with our BHAG (Big, Hairy, Audacious Goal) of inspiring the first commonly known technology industry innovator from a historically underserved community of color.

Budget Request

To support this critical role, we are requesting funding for a one-year salary and associated costs:

- **Base Salary:** \$60,000 (mid-range estimate for a skilled Grants Assistant in New York City).
- **Benefits and Overheads:** \$18,000 (health insurance, payroll taxes, and administrative costs).

Total Request: \$78,000
